First Day of School and School Hours:

School begins at 8:10 a.m. and ends at 3:52 p.m. Monday through Thursday. Fridays, school begins at 8:10 a.m. and ends at 2:08 p.m. Friday early dismissal will be used for staff development. The first day of school for students in grades K-12 will be Wednesday, August 17th, all day and Pre-K Monday, August 22nd all day as well.

CHILDFIND - According to Federal law, all children with disabilities residing in Niobrara Public School district, including children with disabilities who are homeless or wards of the state or attend non-public schools, regardless of the severity of their disabilities, and who are in need of special education and related services, will be identified, located, and evaluated. To locate the children with disabilities, each year we ask the public for assistance.
