Lets finish this 2016-2017 school year with pride and enjoyable memories!





This year our students competed in the following events: Welding, Drone Technology, Restaurant Service, Medical Terminology, Health Knowledge Bowl, Job interview, Extemporaneous Speaking, T-Shirt Design, Metric 500, and Mouse Trap Racers.

The following students received medals: Brady Pike 1st and Ken Justo 1st place in the Metric 500. Stran Fritz 2nd place in Extemporaneous Speaking. Camden Eisenhauer 2nd and Dakota Crosley 3rd place in Mouse Trap Race Cars. The purpose of the organization is to sharpen both hard and soft Skills. Hard Skills are the Technical contests that students compete in. Soft Skills are Leadership contests that students compete in. Preparation for these events/contests is meant to focus a student on a skill giving them close to the real life pressure of being judged by an employer.

We have been successful in our four years of involvement in Skills USA. To date we have had State Champions in: Job Interview, Chapter Business Procedure, and Metric 500. We have medaled in other events as well: Firefighting, Restaurant Service, and Mouse Trap Racers.

On Monday April 3rd the Niobrara Skills USA chapter held a labor and pie auction. Fifteen students and nineteen pies were auctioned.
