North Central District Health Department and your school have partnered together to bring dental services to pre-school, elementary and middle school students. The service will be available at your school on **October 17th.** A Registered Dental Hygienist will provide a dental screening/checkup and apply fluoride varnish, which helps prevent tooth decay. For children covered by Kids Connection or Medicaid, this service is free of charge. A \$15.00 donation is appreciated if your child is not covered by these programs. **However, if you are unable to pay, your child will not be refused service.** Children participating will also receive oral health education, along with a free toothbrush and toothpaste. A note will be sent home with your child if any areas of concern are found during the checkup. This service does not take the place of regular checkups by your family dentist or daily brushing and flossing. You are encourages to allow your child to participate in the screening and preventive fluoride application even if you have a family dentist. Parent permission is required for children to receive services.

Fluoride Varnish Facts

- sticky, honey-like material applied to the teeth with a small brush
- fluoride varnish is safe, adheres to the teeth once it comes into contact with saliva
- fluoride varnish is approved by the American Dental Association and the Federal Drug Administration

Fluoride varnish should be applied up to 4 to 6 times per year, and can decrease further cavity development by about 38%.

Plan To Attend Parent - Teacher Con-

ferences, Wednesday, October 24th. A conference is a time for parents and teachers to share information, solve problems, and form a relationship that will help the student succeed. You don't need to wait for a special invitation though. You can request a meeting with your child's teacher to discuss academic progress at any time. The teacher needs to hear from you and you need to hear from the teacher. You know more about your child than anyone at school. Talking with the teacher about your child will help pave the way for your student to do well in class and will help you understand what is being taught in the classroom. Conferences are usually short and to the point. These tips will help you make the most of your time with your child's teacher.

BEFORE THE CONFERENCE

Find out your child's questions and concerns about school. Check progress reports, report cards and work your child has brought home. Write a list of questions you want to ask the teacher. Bring your list to the meeting with you. Write down information about your child that the teacher should know, such as a family death, divorce, changed finances, illness or a new home. If you need a ride, childcare or a different time or day for the conference, the school can help. Call the school office and ask.

AT THE CONFERENCE

Let the teacher begin the meeting but be sure to ask the questions on your list before time runs out. Ask the teacher what your child should know and be able to do by the end of the school year. Make a plan for how you and the teacher will work with your child to reach those goals. Find out the best way (notes, phone calls, e-mail) and the best time to communicate with the teacher throughout the school year.

Mrs. Jaime Guenther's Goods

Most of the news in this article will be about the fifth grade, but since I teach third and fourth grade math I will add some tid bits about them.

The **fifth** grade is falling right into routine. They know the expectations and have been doing a nice job reaching them. Because of their hard work they enjoyed a movie with brownies as a celebration. School days run so smooth when everyone does their jobs!

Here are a few things they have been working on: reading groups are advancing, Dibels benchmarking and MAPS testing have been completed, language and spelling are teaching us many rules to practice being good writers, and math is introducing new concepts every day.

If you are talking with your child about any skills they are doing, or want to help them, you can have them change the spelling of words adding a suffix. They should be doubling letters, dropping e's, and changing y's to i's if needed. You can also have them outline a simple paragraph by writing a main idea and several supporting details. In math have them multiply three-digit numbers by one digit, add about four numbers together, subtract with regrouping, and find missing numbers. If they keep practicing these skills they will get better and better. I'm so very proud of all they have accomplished so far!

In **third and fourth grade** math we have been have adding new skills each day too. **Third** graders are really working hard at fact families, adding two and three-digit numbers with and without regrouping, and finding the "quarter 'til" and "quarter after" of the hour. These are things they can keep working on so mastery can be sought. **Fourth** graders are working on much of the same as third graders, but with bigger numbers. Right now they need to work on not making silly mistakes and figuring out if their answer is reasonable. Also, an extra concept not noted above is finding the missing number. For example, n-6=13. The answer should be 19. They are taught to work it backwards and add, but they have a hard time doing that when they see the subtract sign.

All the students coming into my classroom have been timely at getting their work handed in. Sometimes the parents must help with the nudging, but overall it has been wonderful! Thank you to all students for being responsible for your learnings, and parents for being helpful toward your child's success. Please come visit me at conferences and bring any questions you may have or call me now if needed. I want us to have an open door of communication.

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
