We have approached the time when fall sports are starting to play their first couple games and regular school session is underway. Please consider how much sleep your child is getting. It's hard to learn when you are sleepy.

3-6 Years Old: 10 - 12 hours per day

Children at this age typically go to bed between 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. and wake up around 6 a.m. and 8 a.m., just as they did when they were younger. At age 3, most children are still napping, while at age 5, most are not. Naps gradually become shorter, as well. New sleep problems do not usually develop after age 3.

7-12 Years Old: 10 - 11 hours per day

At these ages, with social, school, and family activities, bedtimes gradually become later and later, with most 12-years-olds going to bed at about 9 p.m. There is still a wide range of bedtimes, from 7:30 to 10 p.m., as well as total sleep times, from 9 to 12 hours, although the average is only about 9 hours.

12-18 Years Old: 8 - 9 hours per day

Sleep needs remain just as vital to health and well-being for teenagers as when they were younger. It turns out that many teenagers actually may need more sleep than in previous years. However, for many teenagers social pressures conspire against getting the proper amount and quality of sleep. From Webmed.com

Teachers, just email Mrs. Stark with the book title. I want a starting percentage of how many students/teachers read in our school. This way, we can challenge everyone to step up and read!

Literacy information for you!

1 Reason of 6 to Read Aloud to Your Kids

Reading aloud to children creates a lifetime interest in reading. If you start reading to
your children while they are young, they will be much more likely to grow into the habit of
reading. When they associate reading with happy memories, they are more likely to
persist in learning to read, even when they run into occasional roadblocks in the process
of learning to read.

5 Reasons Why Reading is Important for Students

• It expands the student's vocabulary. While reading, they might come across words they have never heard – prompting them to find out what they mean. As a result, they add it to their vocabulary.


This year in the 5th grade class, we have 13 students. They are all unique and keep this classroom fun! We have already been busy learning new things & reviewing material from last year.

Science

In Science, we will be constructing an argument to explain how plants use their structures to survive, grow, and reproduce. We will be dissecting lilies to examine the parts of a flower, as well as observing the features of a Venus Fly Trap and how those features help them survive in their environment!

Reading

During our reading enrichment time, we will be discussing what it means to have a great heart, figuratively and literally. This will require us to dig deep into our brains to discuss the different meanings of having a 'great heart'! This will lead us into our first two texts - 'The Circulatory Story' and 'Love That Dog'.

We will also begin reading 'The Wonderful Wizard of Oz' during Reading Mastery. During our reading, we will discuss character perspectives and fantasy verse reality.

Social Studies and Writing

During Social Studies, we will take a deeper look into Nebraska's geography and how people interact with the land. We will be using maps to locate physical and human features in Nebraska as well as comparing the characteristics of places and regions and their impact on human decisions.

In writing, we will review subject and predicate and begin using editing and proofreading marks to edit sentences. We will also be reviewing statement, question, and exclamatory sentences and the proper end marks that go at the end of these types of sentences.









Together We Can! The Cougars are off to a great start as students and staff opened the school year on August 18. There is a special feeling this year that we all feel, but we can't explain. We believe it is due to the great relationships we have grown over the years and the new faces that bring the school energy, laughter, and learning. Thanks to a grant from the Nutrition Program and the School Board paying for the rest, the purchase of nine new tables have updated the lunchroom. New paint on the walls has created an area that invites all to enter. Students will once again be receiving free breakfast and lunch this year through the Nutrition Program.

Teacher leadership is extremely high at Niobrara Public Schools. High quality educational materials purchased for math and science are a bonus this year. Teachers have been in trainings since August 1 on how to use the materials and all the functionalities of the resources. Thanks to the Curriculum Coordinating Council we have a system wide process of selecting texts and online materials that ensures they meet the local curriculum standards. This process is lead by classroom teachers closest to the action and learning.

Collaboration, cooperation and focus on student success will guide the year and ensure learning opportunities for the students throughout the year.

Through various Federal Grants the school contracts with consulting groups on what best practices and supports are suited for the students. Social emotional learning is a priority for all students. Students receive an individualized learning plan that is customized to each student. The school partners with area agencies to give students access to mental health supports.

As the school year starts, it is the hope of the Niobrara Public School Family that you will show your school support through your actions and words. You are encouraged to attend games, activities, and presentations as they are available and cheer on our students. Thank you for your continued support and pride that you show in all your encounters with Niobrara Public Schools.

Budget for 2021-2022

Niobrara Public Schools (NPS) is publishing the Budget Hearing and Budget Summary Notice as well as the Special Hearing Notice to Set Final Tax Request in this week's paper. School district budgets are to be filed with the Nebraska Auditor of Public Accounts annually before September 20. The following key points are being provided to share with the constituents of the school district for financial transparency.

- 1. 2021-2022 General Fund budget amount totals \$5,661,559; increase of \$205,834 from last year.
- 2. Certification of Taxable Values have increased from \$199,031,907 to \$201,211,299
- 3. State Aid funding has decreased from \$1,804,252 to \$1,685,642 a difference of \$119,128 from last year.
- 4. NPS is asking for the same amount of property tax as last year, \$1,868,687.
- 5. NPS will not be requesting property taxes for the Special Building Fund for the 2021-2022 budget.
- 6. The 2020-2021 tax rate for all Funds was .954113 per \$100 of assessed valuation. The 2021-2022 tax rate proposed for all funds is .928719 (Difference of -.0254). (Yes, you read that correctly, the levy is being lowered.)
- 7. The budget is planned to be funded by State Aid (\$1,685,642), Property Taxes (\$1,868,687) and Federal Funds (\$2,107,230).

The implementation of each of these procedures/programs is to improve the overall educational experience of our students. As always, our students' well-being is our number one priority and ensuring they receive high quality instruction in a safe and healthy environment is always at the forefront of our decision making process. Niobrara Public Schools Evaluation Procedures:

A new evaluation of instructional and professional practices is being implemented this year. The tool is a collaborative process between Administration and classroom teachers. Usually, evaluation tools require one or two formal observations with a follow up meeting. The purpose of evaluation procedures is to impact instructional and professional practices and it takes more than that to have an impact. This year, each teacher will be formally observed a total of at-least four times in both classroom and non-classroom settings. The process also includes self-evaluations, goal setting, and follow up discussions to discuss observations and evaluations. I am really excited about the impact this will have on instructional and professional practices. I have no doubt that I will learn a tremendous amount from our teachers that will improve my leadership skills as well.

Improving Attendance Initiative:

"By 6th grade, chronic absence becomes a leading indicator that a student will drop out of high school." – Attendance Works

Success in school begins with daily attendance! Niobrara Public Schools is putting a focus on attendance and tardiness to school/class. A systematic process has been put in place and communicated to students and in the Student Handbook. Please take the time to learn more about it by looking over the information in the Student Handbook.

We are also putting a focus on students who are showing up to school and class on-time. Students who attend school with a 95% attendance rate will be placed in the "Attendance Matters" group and will receive the reward chosen for each group of students.

High Ability Learners Program:

We are revamping our HAL Program this year to provide opportunities for high ability learners to engage in project-based learning with STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math). Mrs. Motacek has been identified as our HAL teacher and collaborates with teachers to schedule opportunities for all identified HAL students. This will be a collaborative effort between Administration, classroom teachers, parents/guardians, and students. I am looking forward to seeing the growth that takes place through enrichment activities!



MTSS UPDATE

Welcome Back!

What an amazing start to the 2021-2022 school year! Even after just a short time back, it feels like students never left! They are back in the school routine.

In the upcoming weeks, all students will be completing beginning of the year benchmark testing (Acadience, aimswebPlus, and MAP). This information gives teachers the data needed to drive classroom instruction. Students not meeting benchmark will be placed into an intervention and/or will receive prerequisite instruction to address unfinished learning. Progress will be monitored frequently and instructional changes will be made accordingly.
